Description and objectives of the AIAKOS Programme

The EJTN AIAKOS Programme is addressed specifically to future and early-career judges, giving them the opportunity to learn about other judicial systems and training curricula, enhance their knowledge of EU law and judicial cooperation instruments as well as meet with their counterparts and develop useful contacts for their future professional life.

The AIAKOS Programme's objectives are:

- To bring together future or newly appointed judges from different EU Member States;
- To foster mutual understanding of different European judicial cultures and systems;
- To raise awareness of the European dimension of their (future) work.

Specificity of the host institution

The National Institute of Magistracy is a public autonomous institution providing initial training to future judges and prosecutors. The activities that NIM usually includes in the AIAKOS Programme are specially designed for the foreign participants within the framework of the general objectives of the programme. These activities have different characteristics and contents aiming to broaden horizons on judicial systems, training curricula and judicial cooperation among the European countries.
