

Welcome to the Academy of Justice of the state Brandenburg

The Academy of Justice of state Brandenburg is the main institution of further education for the entire judiciary of the state Brandenburg (with the exception of law enforcement) and primarily for higher grades of service of the State Berlin. Events are mainly attended by judges, prosecutors, assistant state prosecutors, judicial officers, bailiffs, service employees, master-sentinels of justice and staff of social services.

The academy started up in Kolpin (rural district Oder-Spree) in May 1993. In 2008, it moved to its new location in Königs Wusterhausen.



At present, more than 400 events on further education with more than 6000 participants take place each year. The seminars are geared towards work-related necessities and take the latest developments in legislation and jurisdiction into account. There is a diverse choice on offer ranging from topics on criminal, civil and family law amongst which include subjects for the staff of ordinary jurisdiction and departments of public prosecution, to conferences for specialised jurisdiction (such as administrative, social, work and financial jurisdiction), as well as behaviour-oriented offers with the focus on judicial matters. The academy offers coaching on entry controls (body search, firearms law, luggage X-raying, etc.), self-defence techniques as well as the obligatory fitness tests at regular intervals for masters-sentinels of justice.

The Academy of Justice in Königs Wusterhausen has one lecture hall, three seminar rooms, two self-study rooms, one training room with security technology, a gym and three computer cabinets with state-of-the-art conference technology at its disposal. In the seminar building, there is a library with a separate judicial professional section, attended to by the Academy of Justice. Participants can be accommodated in single rooms with modern furnishing on request.

For recreational purposes, the Training and Further Education Centre Königs Wusterhausen offer TV rooms, a cafeteria, a bowling lane, table tennis, fitness equipment, bicycles and an outdoor sports ground (volleyball, basketball, football, tennis and badminton).

The small town of Königs Wusterhausen and its idyllic surroundings, including the Notte canal, are inviting incentives for long walks, bicycle tours and running.
