Close to the CEJ, within 15 minutes walking distance, **Brown's Hotels** are fresh and modern places. Its location – near the Rossio and two steps away from the Terreiro do Paço – makes it the ideal hotel to enjoy the bustle of the city of Lisbon. The rooms are comfortable, breakfast is complete and the hotel's public areas are, besides colorful in that just right kind of way and the stage for exhibitions and artists, an invitation to relax with a good conversation or to get lost among the many available books.

Also close to the CEJ (within 15 minutes walking distance), located in downtown Baixa, **My Story Hotels** are usually a creative renovation of historic buildings. The properties enjoy privileged locations in the historic center of Lisbon, just about 300 meters from Rossio and Praça do Comércio, which overlooks the Tagus River.

Close to CEJ, within 10 minutes walking distance, the **Lisboa Prata Boutique Hotel** is in the heart of Lisboa's downtown center, in a building of the eighteenth century, with the preservation of panels of *azulejos*, archaeological traces and ancient walls, overlooking the neighborhoods of Baixa-Chiado, Castelo de São Jorge, Alfama and the Tagus Estuary.

IV. Directions and Transportation

Directions and transportation / Accès et transports – Transfer from Lisbon Portela Airport to the City Centre

Lisbon Portela Airport is just under 10 km from the city centre. For information on transfers from Lisbon Portela Airport to Baixa Pombalina (Lisbon's downtown, where the hotels mentioned above are located) follow the links below:

- travelling <u>by bus</u>: you can buy an electronic card **7** colinas/Viva Viagem (0.50€) at the ticket machines at the station and load your trips. A one-way ticket (valid for all metro/bus/tram lines) will

cost you 1.50€ (6.45€ for a 24hr ticket). (Check out the **public transportation fares** here and the **bus** lines here.)

- travelling <u>by underground</u>: the Airport Metro Line (**red** line) operates from 06:30 to 01:00 and will take you from the airport directly to the city centre/downtown ("Baixa Chiado"). Just switch from the **red** line to the **green** line at the stop "Alameda". From there it is only six stops to "Baixa Chiado". (Check out the **Metropolitano de Lisboa Network Diagram** here.)
- by taxi: Taxis are available outside the Arrivals Terminal. The fare should be of approximately 15€-25€ to the city centre. (Check out possible taxi fares here.) Should you need to call a taxi while you are in Lisbon, you can call the 24hr line Taxis Lisboa: 00351 21 936 21 13.

Some "Must See/Do" Tips

Should you have some time to spare or decide to stay for the weekend, here are some tips on the "must see" places in Lisbon:

- Take <u>Tram 28</u> at Baixa Chiado and enjoy a ride through some of the most scenic places in Lisbon;
- Stop by <u>Belém</u> for the best <u>Pastéis de Nata</u> in Lisbon (accompanied with sugar and cinnamon trust us, add the latter), a tour of the <u>Jerónimos Monastery</u> and the <u>Belém Tower</u> (UNESCO World Heritage), some modern and contemporary art at the <u>CCB</u> (Cultural Centre of Belém), and a great view of the river. From *Praça do Comércio* take Bus 714 towards Outurela, Bus 728 towards Restelo, or Tram 15E towards Algés and just get off at *Belém-Jerónimos*;
- Stop by <u>Docas</u> ('harbour') for a nice lunch or dinner by the riverside (if you can, check out the great bookstore <u>Ler Devagar</u> on your way there);
- Go to Alfama, the oldest district in Lisbon, for some Fado music and some ginjinha (traditional liqueur);
- Stop by the Café A Brasileira to have your picture taken with the statute of one of Portugal's greatest poets, Fernando Pessoa, and walk up to <u>Bairro Alto</u> for a wide selection of restaurants, bars, music and much more!

Food & drinks

"Lisboa is a city where eating is most definitely a pleasure. Slow meals, intense, full of flavours and conversation."

- Codfish: the Portuguese are known for their ability of cooking this fish in a variety of different ways. We would recommend "bacalhau a braz" and "bacalhau com natas";
- *Traditional sweets*: convent-based sweets are of fundamental importance in Lisboa's diet. Pastéis de Nata are just the beginning...
- Beer & tremoços although Portugal is not known for its beers, "Imperial" (beer on tap) and tremoços (lupini beans) are a common sight on sunny days;
- Wines: from Douro to Alentejo, red, white and even dessert wines (Porto), Portugal has certainly a lot to offer.
