• Brief description of the AIAKOS Programme (current description in EJTN brochure):

The programme is addressed specifically to future and early-career judges/ prosecutors, giving them the opportunity to learn about other judicial systems and training curricula, enhance their knowledge of EU law and judicial cooperation instruments as well as meet with their counterparts and develop useful contacts for their future professional life.

• General objectives of the AIAKOS programme:

- To bring together future or newly-appointed judges and prosecutors from different EU Member States;
- To foster mutual understanding of different European judicial cultures and systems;
- To raise awareness of the European dimension of their (future work);
- Specificity of the host institution

The National School of the Judiciary is the sole Institute in Greece that is entitled by the Greek Law to train judges, administrative judges and prosecutors in order to preside (Initial Training) in Courts and educate judges, administrative judges and prosecutors to be tutors in the School and participate to domestic and foreign conferences etc (Continuous Training and Education)

• Key points for the host institution's programme

Obtain knowledge in EU Law (participate in courses regarding sectors of EU Law topics with Greek students)

Introducing the judicial systems of the participants Acquaintance with the Greek Courts and Prosecution Office Visit to the Detention Center and the Police Headquarters Socialize with the Greek Students and tutors Visit the most interesting sites of Thessaloniki

- 2) Attending classrooms (EU Competition Law, EU Criminal Law and Proceedings)

- 3) Presentation of the judiciary system of the hosts and the participants
- 4) Visit to the detention center and the Police Headquarters
- 5) Visit to sites and museums
